



For your visit to Windsor, Ontario, Canada, we have put together the following list of tips so that you understand the local laws and are prepared for your travels.

- Travel to and from Canada requires that you have a valid passport. A birth certificate and photo ID are not acceptable for air travel or crossing the U.S. border by land.
- If you are traveling with a person under 18 who is not your child or ward, you must have a letter from a parent or guardian granting him or her permission to travel to Canada or to U.S. while in Canada.
- Citizens of the U.S., most European countries, most former British colonies, and certain other countries (Israel, Korea, and Japan, for instance) do not need visas but must carry passports to enter Canada. To find out if you require a visa please visit [www.cic.gc.ca](http://www.cic.gc.ca)
- All prescription medication should be packed in your carry-on luggage in their original containers.
- The legal drinking age in Ontario is 19 years. Valid ID is required and may be asked for when buying or consuming alcohol in Ontario establishments. Alcohol can only be consumed in licensed establishments and private residences. Alcohol cannot be consumed in public areas inside/outside or in player's dressing rooms.
- Operating motorized vehicles of any type while impaired is illegal.
- It is recommended that visitors use Canadian funds in Ontario. Many establishments are only able to accept Canadian currency. Traveler's checks are accepted as well as most major credit cards. There are also currency exchanges available locally at Caesars Windsor Hotel and Casino as well as some major airports.
- You must be 19 years of age or older to purchase or consume tobacco products in Ontario. Smoking is not permitted in establishments and outdoor areas such as restaurant patios, hotel rooms or their grounds. - Firearms and ammunition are not allowed into Canada.

- Ontario laws restrict gambling to those 19 and over and request that those that are underage not enter their establishments. Valid ID is required and may be asked for when entering a gambling establishment.
- It is strongly recommended that you obtain health insurance before leaving your home province or country.
- A valid driver's license from any country is good in Canada for three months, but you may want to get an International Driver's License before your trip if you plan on driving while in Ontario. For more information on Ontario driving laws please visit:
